

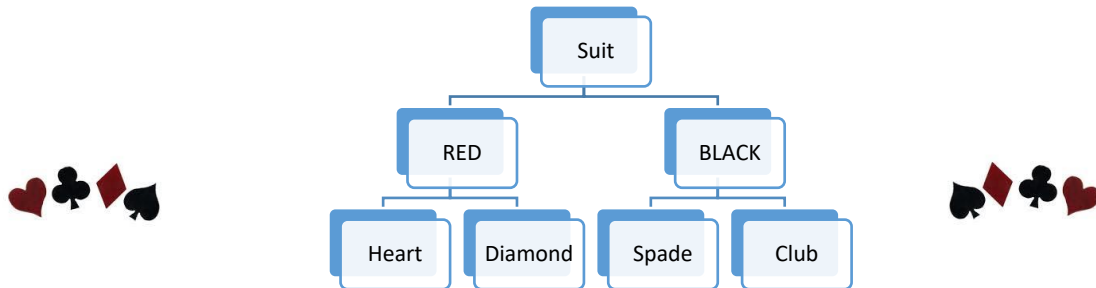
Playing Card Dowsing

There are many ways to use playing cards (or patterned cards of any type) to assist dowsing practice and strengthen your intuitive sense. This handout details one method of doing so:

Choose one card out of the playing card deck and set it directly in front of you, face down. Set the rest of the deck aside and focus only on this one card.

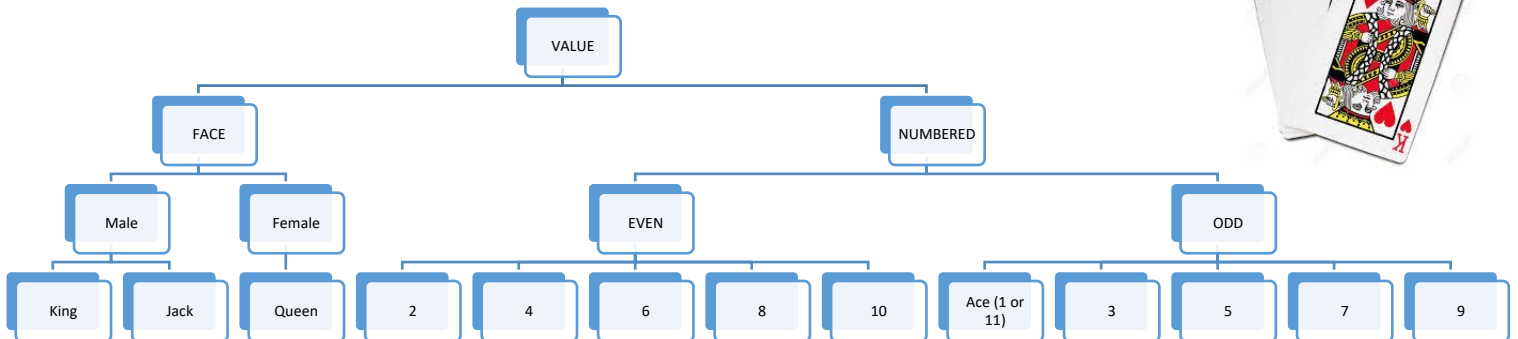
First, determine the card's **SUIT**. Break your questions down so that your "YES/NO" response will automatically lead you to the next level.

For example, if you enquire, "Is this card's suit a RED suit?" and you receive a "NO" response, then you may automatically conclude that it is indeed a BLACK suit and proceed to enquire, "Is this card's suit a SPADE?" and a "NO" response automatically indicates that it must be a CLUB suit card.



(After determining the **SUIT**, you may choose to flip the card over and continue using only the **SUIT** as your point of interest. However, if you want to go farther, proceed to the second step below)

Second, determine the card's **VALUE**. Break your questions down again as with determining the **SUIT**, but this time, there is an extra level of questioning to get to the exact card **VALUE**.



Once you get to a numbered **VALUE**, determine if the number is **EVEN** or **ODD**. You may choose to stay at this level and flip over the card. However, you may also wish to determine the exact number. In this case, simply proceed through the list of choices—one at a time—until you receive a "YES" response.

For example, if you receive a "NO" response to, "Is this a FACE card?" then you automatically know that you will proceed with asking about a number. The next question may be, "Is the number on this card an EVEN number?" and a "NO" response would indicate that it is an ODD number. From here, simply list each ODD value and wait for a "YES" response.

Now flip over your card and see how close your dowsing has lead you to the correct suit and value of the card. TA DA!

Remember to celebrate the successes and don't let any incorrect responses get you down. It's all part of practice. Also, pay close attention to any quick flashes of knowing or visions of what the card's colour, suit, or value may be. Remember that dowsing is only part of the process of developing your intuitive sense. Sometimes, with practice and focus, we are able to intuit the card value or suit just from touching or being in proximity to the face-down card.
